A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are **back in the saddle**. The trail we are riding, again, is a familiar one, but also has some new twists.

Starting on the 9th, we are "back in the saddle" with our three worship service schedule each weekend. Many have expressed how they liked the "full" church during the summer and meeting other members that normally attend a different worship time. This has been a good experiment that has provided positive **fellowship**. The Board of Elders have discussed this and welcome any comments for next year. We resume with three services, because we know many will be getting "back in the saddle" after their summer vacations have ended.

School has started. On the 9th we will also experience the familiar teacher rededication, but we will be observing something new. We will receive our National Lutheran Schools Accreditation certificate, which means we examined how we travel down the trail. We are the same school but have plans for a fresh and improved approach.

We welcome "back in the saddle" previous students who know the trail here, but I am delighted to say we have several new students.

- Some have enrolled because they heard about us through family or friends that told them about St. Paul Lutheran. Please consider how you can help promote our church and school.
- We also have some that discovered us through our advertising efforts. It is amazing how many people do not know St. Paul Lutheran offers a Christian education from Preschool through 8th grade. This past August we gave out flyers in the festival parade for our youth group's free carwash. The flyer invited everyone to a free carwash at St. Paul Lutheran Church and SCHOOL (my emphasis added). A family that never knew we had a school at St. Paul enrolled their child because the flyer included the word school. This short

phrase "and school" gave us the opportunity to share Jesus with another child in our community. Praise God for the flyers and those who helped pass them out.

- The school open house was a great success. Thank you to all who took time to come and see what the faculty and staff do to pass on the faith through this ministry of St. Paul Lutheran Church. I was delighted to see some alumni that have enrolled their children for this coming year. Alumni, now as parents, want their children to receive an education within a distinctively Christian environment. This shows that what we have done in the past is bearing fruit.

What else? We are riding the trail again with two pastors. Hallelujah! The Rev. Tim Martinal (pronounced Martin-all) is here and ready to serve as our Associate Pastor. He realizes his last name can be a mouthful, so he is happy to answer to "Pastor" or "Pastor Tim" (when needing to distinguish between the pastors). Although we have two pastors again, pastors are not miracle workers. Pastor Tim's arrival will give us a new perspective and fresh start in many areas of ministry, but we also need every member to be engaged in this journey. Each of us can join the Apostle Paul and say, "*I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus*" (Phil. 3:14). This is a great time for us all to get "back in the saddle" as we journey on the trail Jesus leads us down.

The Bookkeeper's Corner

School has begun which means fundraising is kicking into high gear! Many of you participate in just about every fundraiser we have; others like to support certain favorite fundraisers. Whatever your preference, the folks raising the money are appreciative of all your support!

I've been asked "how much do we make" and "what happens with the money". Good questions: here are some answers.

a) The August 2018 Summer Festival Fish Booth: gross proceeds are at \$16,527. We've only paid a few bills so far, so won't know the net profit until next month. This event supports the PTL.

b) The August 2018 Summer Festival Hot Dog Booth: as like the Fish Booth, we haven't paid all the bills yet, but we're standing at \$3,127. The net profit will go to support the Spring Washington DC trip.

c) Also during the Summer Festival, a 5K run was organized. The total income was \$215, but have not yet paid the bills. The net profit will go to the Spring Washington DC trip.

d) The Youth held a "free" carwash and washed 145 cars. Pledges and donations for the event totaled over \$2,000! The youth are giving 10% of their profit to the church general fund (now there's servanthood!) and the balance will support their youth activities for all three groups: **Spark** (grades 3-5), **Ignite** (grades 6-8) and **Impact** (grades 9-12). The Youth also support our Compassion Child, Kwame, with a monthly donation of \$45.00.

Yes, August was a busy month! All these activities took an extraordinary amount of time, effort, and sacrifice by the numerous volunteers to make it successful. Hebrews 13:16 tells us "*do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased*".

We can thank our forefathers who had the wisdom to start this perpetual fund with a few thousand dollars. Today it has grown to over \$600,000. Your estate gifts to the Trust & Investment fund is the gift that keeps on giving.

Your gift is invested and the principal amount cannot be spent. The interest and dividends will be spent on projects or equipment that would not be part of the church's general fund budget. Any recognized board of our church can apply for disbursement of such funds annually. Requests will be reviewed by the Trust & Investment committee and if approved, the requests will go to the Voter's Assembly for final approval.

When a member designates St. Paul Lutheran Church as a beneficiary of their estate, they can specify exactly where they would like their gift to go. Some examples might be: General Fund, Building Fund, Missions, School or Trust & Investment. If you do not specify in your will/estate, your gift will go to Trust & Investment per the bylaws in the church constitution.

I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you for setting aside monies for a mission trip this year without me even asking. What a nice surprise! Belize has many churches (Pentecostal), but at the present time, only has one LCMS pastor. As you can see, they have several children and live in Seine Bight, Belize. He has also been asked to reach out to the people in Belmopan, capitol city area, to hopefully establish a mission church in that area, along with maintaining his ministry among the people of Seine Bight. The last I had read, they were in the process of raising funds for a church building in Seine Bight. As it rains over 180 inches a year, a roof is of the essence. Pastor Markie Burch and his wife have also moved to Belize to aid Pastor Miessner in the Spanish language. As Belize says English is their main language, the truth is, many speak Spanish, as many people are immigrants. English is mainly spoken by tourist guides and educated people.

I ask you to please keep Pastor Miessner and his family in your prayers. Pray for health and safety in his daily travels, and for encouragement, as he shares the gospel to the people of Belize. Thank you again for your generosity and hopefully others will step forward to serve in the mission field.

What Story can You Tell?

People love stories. They love to hear stories and maybe even more, they love to tell stories. Think about Biblical times. The Old Testament accounts were not written down for everyone to read; they were passed along by the elders telling and re-telling the stories of God's judgements and love to the younger generations.

You may remember hearing the stories of the traveling Medicine Show. Not only did they have the liniments, ointments and potions to sell, they had the stories from days and miles of travel. It was the stories of men and women, satisfied customers, that made the townspeople take notice and believe. The stories held the hope that made people spend the hard earned cash on the cure.

Just like the townspeople, we know the story. But we have the true story of Hope. The story of Jesus' birth, His life, death and resurrection to pay for our sins and through Grace give to us the gift of eternal life in Heaven. It is Jesus' story but it is also our story. We are forgiven and our future is secure. How many people can we influence to believe and join us in the choir praising God forever?

Penn Gillette, a member of the famous illusionist pair of Penn and Teller, really drove the point home about telling the Gospel story. He stated he doesn't respect believers who don't proselytize. If you believe there is a Heaven and a Hell and people could be going to Hell, but you think it is not really worth telling them because it might be socially awkward....how much do you have to hate somebody to believe that everlasting life is possible and not tell them that? We are all called to be fishers of men. We may be uncomfortable in our abilities to share the Gospel but we are in good company. Even Moses gave numerous reasons why he wasn't the right one to lead the people. Job ran away when told to tell the people. We are not alone, and we have a great story to tell.
