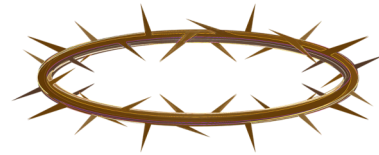

Laypower*

As of February 8, 2023, there are approximately 559 congregations and preaching stations in The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod that have pastoral vacancies. This means there is no pastor to carry on the work of Christ's urgent commission in their established parish. . .not to mention the many more pastors and missionaries that could be utilized for the development of new mission fields throughout America and the world. Of those 559 congregations, 424 are looking for a sole pastor, 45 for a Senior pastor, and 90 for an assistant Pastor.

Whose fault is this?

The fault lies with us laymen. A good share of the problems of today's church lie with us laymen. . .laymen who have forgotten that it is their church and that they must take an active, loving, concerned interest in its welfare.

You think laymen can't accomplish much? You think laymen were meant to "pay and pray but have not much to say?" Wrong.

If laymen are exuding the proper influence in their own "little corner" of Christ's Kingdom. . .the Church will be immeasurably blessed and God will multiply their efforts to astounding proportions.

During the next 10 years, approximately 50 percent of our pastors will be eligible for retirement. Therefore, encouraging men to explore a church vocation is an ongoing activity, vital to the future of the LCMS in carrying out the Great Commission.

Confirmation classes, young adult groups, and other lay activities provide pastors and laymen with an opportunity to identify and encourage men to prayerfully consider serving our Lord in the pastoral ministry

LET ME TELL YOU a little story that shows what a simple act by one layman can bring to Christ's church.

George was learning to be a cabinet-maker. His brother, however, saw in him the makings of a minister. He noticed how his brother would slip away to read and to study whenever he could.

The brother encouraged George to enter the ministry. It would not be easy. The family was poor. There was no student aid. George listened to his brother and through his brother's encouragement heard Christ's call.

What happened?

Because of this layman brother's encouragement, Christ's Church thus far has been blessed with a total of 368 years of preaching and teaching service. . .that's right 368 years!

George Ferber served as a pastor for 43 years. Those 43 years alone would have been rich enough a blessing to the church.

But there is more.

GEORGE FERBER HAD FOUR SONS. His son Waldemar has served the Lutheran mission to the deaf as a minister for 59 years. Another son, Gerhardt, has served the deaf mission as well as chaplaincies to the military and mentally ill for 53 years. Still another son, Alvin, has been active in the deaf ministry for 52 years. A fourth son, Hugo, has been a parish minister in Michigan's Thumb area for 50 years.

Four sons. . .214 years of pastoral service to Christ's kingdom!

But there is more.

George Ferber had three daughters as well. His daughter, Cordelia, has been a Lutheran parochial teacher for 55 years, while her sister, Thusnelda, has been a parochial Lutheran teacher for 51 years. . .and a third sister, Erna, has—in addition to her many years of dedicated lay service—served eight years with the Army-Navy Commission and in more recent years as an organist.

368 YEARS OF SERVICE to Christ's Kingdom. . .a span of years stretching back a dozen years before the Pilgrims and Plymouth Rock.

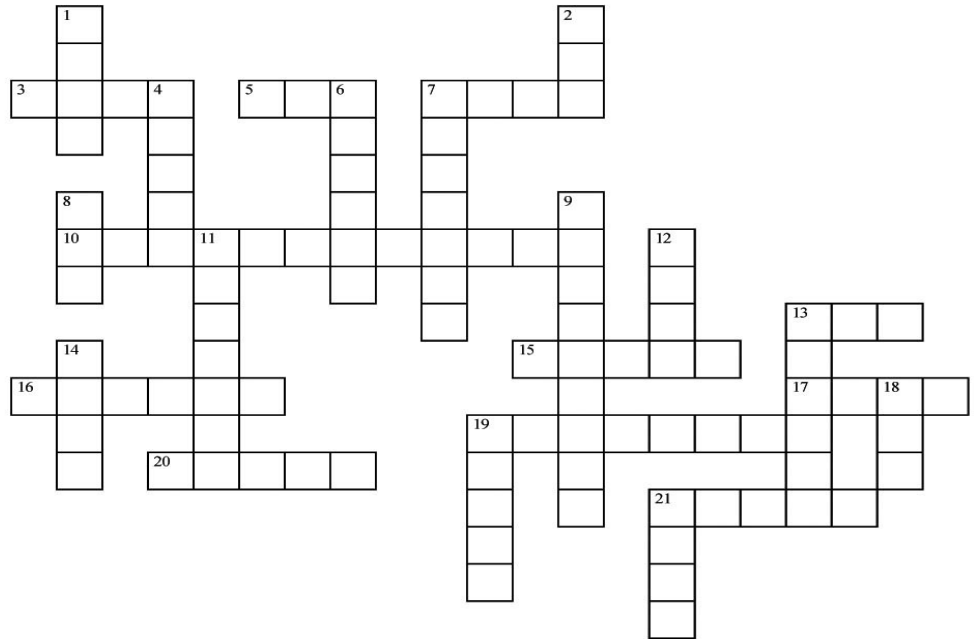
. . .all because one layman encouraged a gifted brother.

The Church first and foremost is laymen! What a force for good would be unleashed if suddenly each of them took the importance of their role of "layman" seriously!

* This article is a reprint of a September 1976 article in The Michigan Lutheran. It was written by Rudy Petzold. Only the number of vacancy congregations in Synod had been changed to reflect the current count as of February 2023. It also is in response to a resolution passed at the 2022 Michigan District Convention asking congregations to encourage young people to enter the teaching and pastoral ministry. A simple comment to a young person can go a long way toward service in the church.

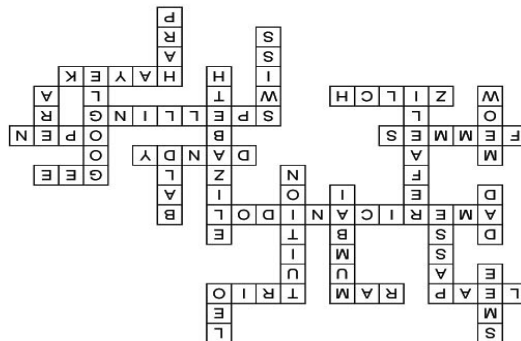

The Time of Easter - Holy Week

The week before Easter is called Holy Week. Our Lenten preparation and repentance deepens as we focus on the events of Jesus' life from His entrance into Jerusalem until His death on the cross and burial in the garden tomb.

Palm Sunday, the first day of Holy Week, commemorates the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem (Matthew 21:1-11). Because the complete account of the Lord's Passion from Matthew, Mark, or Luke is often read, this Sunday is also called the Sunday of the Passion.

On Holy (Maundy) Thursday, the Church gives thanks to Jesus for the institution of His Supper. This is a feast day, and the color used to decorate the church is white. The Holy Thursday service closes with the stripping of the altar. This reminds us of how our Lord stripped to the waist to wash His disciples' feet - and how He was stripped and beaten before His crucifixion.

Good Friday is the most solemn of all days in the Christian Church; yet a note of joy remains, as the title of the day indicates. On Good Friday, as we remember that on account of our sin the Lord was crucified and died, we give joyful thanks to God that all sin and God's wrath over sin falls on Jesus and not on us, and that by His grace we receive the benefit of this most sacrificial act.

During Holy Week, we worship our Lord, who gave His life for us.

Holy Week Practices and Traditions

- ◆ In many churches, the color for Holy Week continues to be violet. In others, the color is scarlet, a deep blood red. Scarlet reminds us of Jesus' blood shed as He suffered and died for our sins.
- ◆ Many congregations read the Passion narrative during special midweek services of Lent. But on each day of Holy Week, the whole story of the events leading to Jesus' death and burial is read from a single Gospel.
- ◆ While in Lent, we forego using the joyous Alleluia response, and we do not sing the Gloria in Excelsis. In Holy Week, we go a step further as we give up singing the Gloria Patri - our joyous praise to the Trinity at the end of all the Psalms we use in worship. Omitting these joyous words makes our worship even more reserved and somber.
- ◆ Many churches observe Holy Week by gathering for special services throughout the week.
