A Message from Pastor Bruner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In his younger years he was involved in a rebellion against others who believed that white people in Africa were better than blacks. The Apartheid of South Africa deprived black people of their citizenship and restricted political power to white supremacists. The natural outcome of Apartheid was hatred between races of different skin color. To many people the conflict was as plain as black and white.

Mandla Khumalo was a young black man who hated whites. He joined in the resistance and rebellion against the white governmental policies. He destroyed property and disrupted the peace wherever he traveled. If caught he could have been imprisoned or worse. Constant hiding became his way of life. One day he and his friends sought safe refuge in the home of a Christian. There was one condition for their room and board. They were required to attend a worship service. Mandla reluctantly attended. It was during the sermon that Mandla learned that the problem in his country of South Africa was not black(s) and white(s). The problem was SIN!

The remainder of this abbreviated story is that Mandla's heart was changed. He went to the police station to turn himself in. He admitted his involvement in anti-Apartheid activities. The officer at the station listened to Mandla and became confused. He went and got the sheriff, who was also amazed as Mandla confessed his rebellion and offered to be arrested. The sheriff told him, "Don't do it anymore. Now go." Mandla continued to grow in his Christian faith and eventually traveled to America where he attended our Fort Wayne seminary. He is now Rev. Mandla Khumalo and serves the Lutheran church in Africa.

There are many problems in our world. Many people have anger and hatred toward others. We can come up with many explanations and reasons for the division between people, but Rev. Khumalo is correct. The real problem is not black and white. The true problem is SIN!

You and I can face a variety of problems in life. It is safe to say that the source to our problems is the same as it is in South Africa and everywhere. The problem is three letters long and "I" am in the middle of it. Can you say to God and yourself that "I am the center of the problem?" Thankfully, God has given us a solution that can change the heart. God has shown us unconditional love through His only Son. Whatever color Jesus' skin was, He died for ALL people, so that whoever believes in Him will have forgiveness and therefore eternal life. Everytime we have a change of heart and turn ourselves in to God, something amazing happens. God reminds us that He has taken the punishment for us and in similar fashion God says, "Don't do it anymore. Now go."

Imagine how different life would be if we lived as God's forgiven and forgiving family.

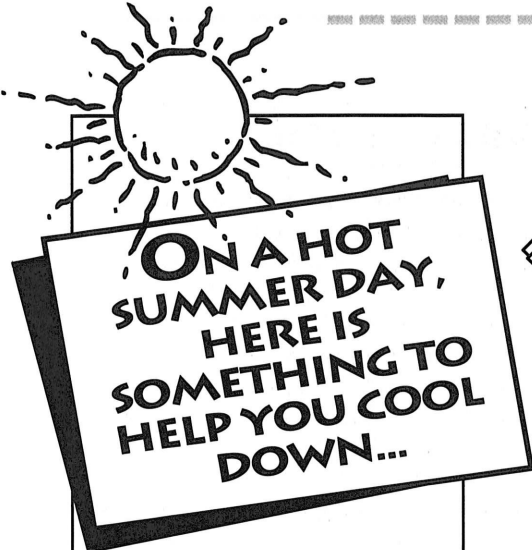
Guidelines for the O AFC Host Families

Thank you, on behalf of the O AFC ministry, for what you have already done and will be doing to make this outreach weekend a success. We regard the Ambassador's stay in your host home as a vital part of our ministry. The Ambassadors have the opportunity to experience how you and your Christ centered family live out your relationships with our Lord Jesus. As host parents, we ask you to assist in the following ways:

1. **It is expected that all youth attending the weekend event participate in the entire weekend.** We ask that you as host parents take your guests directly home and not allow them to leave your home for any reason. Our desire is that they visit with you, their host family.
2. **Arrange to transport the O AFC members assigned to you** (the driver should be over 21). We encourage the arranging of car pools where possible.
 - Friday evening - pick up at 9:45 p.m.*
 - Saturday morning - bring to church by 8:00 a.m.*
 - Saturday evening - pick up at 9:30 p.m.*
 - Sunday - bring to church 20 minutes prior to service.*
3. **Provide breakfast Saturday and Sunday mornings.**
4. **The youth are to go to bed when you do or no later than 11:59PM.** You have the authority to discipline. This includes encouraging them to study their witnessing methods, sending them to bed so they get a good night's sleep, discouraging loud talking, texting, using cell phones, etc. Please report any needs or behavioral difficulties by contacting the lead director.

O AFC Weekends seek to be Christ-centered in everything that is done. May the Lord bless all who serve so that Christ is honored and glorified.

NOTE: Host families are a vital part of the O AFC ministry. The Ambassadors are instructed to treat you and your home with respect.
