The Bookkeeper's Corner

As promised in the last Messenger, somewhere in this Messenger is our calendar year 2019 budget vs actuals.

Summary: Voter's passed a surplus budget of \$544.00 for the year 2019. We ended with a deficit of (\$37,419.84) in the General Fund checking. In December 2019 the Voter's passed a deficit budget of (\$54,425) for calendar year 2020, so we're starting in the hole.

On the mortgage front, we've been advertising our mortgage will be paid off in October 2022 if nothing changes. Well, something changed. Every five years our mortgage interest balloons (changes) which creates a new amortization schedule. The church council met for an interim meeting to discuss the options presented by CEF:

- Keep the mortgage at \$14,135/month, accept the new interest rate at 3.875% and extend the mortgage by a few months.
- Change the mortgage payment to something we can handle, accept the new interest rate at 3.875% and extend the mortgage by several years. In both cases, the church could pay off the mortgage early with no penalty.

The church council voted for Option a: we will keep the monthly mortgage at \$14,135/month at the new percentage rate. As soon as the new amortization schedule arrives, I'll communicate our new mortgage payoff date in the bulletin and Messenger.
