Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
What did one light bulb say to the other on Valentine's Day? "I love you a whole watt."

That is a bad joke. It is also a poor expression of love if the bulb is more than 1 watt. Think of how small "a whole watt" is out of a 60, 75, or 100 watt bulb.

It looks as weak as a man who once gave his girlfriend a 6 carrot ring. Yes, I spelled carrot correctly. He thought he would be funny and wire together six miniature carrots to a ring. He gave it to her for Valentines. She was not impressed. Amazingly, she still married the guy when he later gave her a ring with a real diamond (in real carat measurements).

So what is with the poor attempt at humor involving love? This month we start the season of Lent on Valentine's Day. What should bring laughter and lasting joy to our hearts is that God loves us a whole lot.

God showed His love for us with more than a diamond ring. It is a miracle that we are loved so much. He showed His love by pointing out all our sin and then offering us complete forgiveness. Jesus suffered a gruesome punishment on a cross and eventually died for all of our sin. In the middle of the day on Good Friday, it was dark for three hours, while Jesus hung on the cross. The soldiers had taken the only possessions he had and cast lots for them. Most likely, he was naked and had nothing of value left. He had nothing to offer anyone except His perfect life as an exchange for all the sins of the world.

Some may consider His suffering and death as foolish as a 6 carrot ring, but it was quite the opposite. The love behind the

action is far greater for those who understand the love behind the gift.

"For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God."

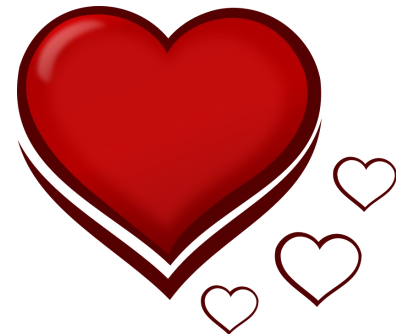

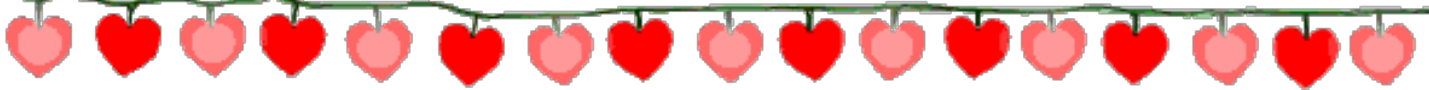

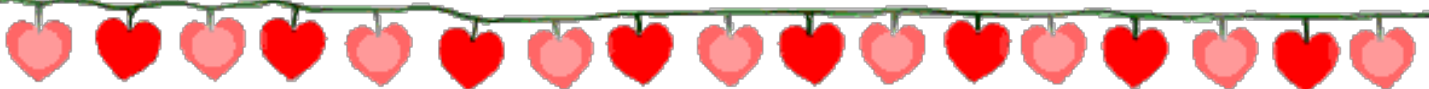

TRUST & INVESTMENT – PERPETUAL GIVING FUND

When a member designates St. Paul Lutheran Church as a beneficiary of their estate, they can specify exactly where they would like their gift to go. Some examples might be, General Fund, Missions, School or the Trust & Investment Perpetual Fund. If you **do not specify in your will/estate**, your gift will go to the Trust & Investment Fund per the bylaws of the church constitution.

Members may elect to donate directly to Trust & Investment through memorials or by gifts.

Gifts to Trust & Investment are the gifts that keep on giving.

Gifts are invested and the principal amount cannot be spent. The earnings will be spent on projects or equipment that are not budgeted in the General Fund (examples; special needs or unexpected events). Any recognized board of our church can apply for disbursements of such funds. Requests are reviewed by the Trust & Investment Committee to see if it meets the fund guidelines. If a request is approved by the Trust & Investment Committee, the requests will go to the Voter's Assembly for final approval.

We are currently accepting applications for disbursement of available earnings in the amount of \$62,069.48. Applications are available on line, or you can pick one up at the church office. Deadline for submitting applications is April 1, 2024. You can return the application in person to the church office or email to tdglady@yahoo.com.

Call the church office and we'll get you set up. Once you get set up, you can check your statement at any time. **Year end giving statements will not be printed** unless you ask for one.

Thrivent Action Teams

Did you know that if you're a Thrivent member, you can apply for a **\$250 gift card** to help with a service activity or fundraiser? These have been used numerous time to supplement dinners. More proceeds are able to go directly to the cause rather than buying food and supplies.

How it Works - Think about a need in our church or community and how you could help. Apply to lead a project in a one-time fundraiser, service activity or educational event that can be completed within 90 days. Once your project is approved, you'll receive a \$250 Impact Card you can use as seed money to get your project off the ground and make a bigger impact. You may also order shirts, notebooks, thank you cards, and more. Details and guidelines can be found online.

How often am I eligible? Benefit members are eligible for two Thrivent Action Teams per year, and associate members one per year.

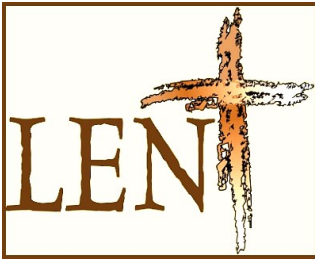

— Lent Begins

The Time of Easter - Lent

Begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday.

The Time of Easter invites us into the story of Jesus' sacrificial death and His glorious resurrection. The resurrection of Jesus gives proof that our salvation has been completed and that our hope for eternal life with God is secure.

Easter was the major celebration of the Early Church, which also set aside a period of preparation to celebrate the Feast of the Resurrection of Our Lord (Easter). Lent was a period of preparation first prescribed for baptismal candidates. During this period, the candidates were examined in preparation for Baptism at the Easter (or Paschal) Vigil. Later, these forty days were associated with Jesus' forty days in the desert prior to His temptation (Matt. 4:1-11) and with the forty years the children of Israel spent in the wilderness (Num. 14:34), becoming a period of preparation for every Christian.

The Sundays during this season are not "of Lent" but "in Lent." Thus the Sundays retain an Easter tone and may be less solemn than the mid-week services that congregations typically offer. The observances of Lent are concrete reminders of the greater solemnity of this season, yet Lutherans emphasize the Gospel of Christ as central even to this penitential season.

In Lent, we prepare our hearts to receive our crucified and risen Lord.

Lent Practices and Traditions

- ◆ The church is decorated in violet, the color of royalty and repentance. This period of repentance is marked by a purposeful turning away from our sin and turning toward Christ for His mercy and forgiveness.
- ◆ Ash Wednesday begins the observance of Lent. Ashes on the forehead is a sign of penitence and a reminder that we, too, shall die and therefore need forgiveness from Jesus. Black may be used to decorate the church of Ash Wednesday.
- ◆ *Alleluia* is the Hebrew word for "Praise the Lord." It is a joyous expression of faith in God. During Lent, we forego using this joyous response in order to focus on our need for repentance and faith.
- ◆ As in Advent, so in Lent, we do not sing the Gloria in Excelsis in the Divine Service. We do this to focus our worship on repentance.
- ◆ Fasting is giving up eating at a particular meal or time in order to devote that time to prayer and meditation of the Word of God.
- ◆ Many churches observe Lent by gathering for midweek services. These additional time of worship and gathering around God's Word help us prepare to observe Holy Week and celebrate Easter.

And since the reading plan doesn't take the whole month (especially since there's a bonus day in February this year), we have also included resources for reading **Colossians**, if you would like to. If your spirit hungers for even more, check out the Daily Lectionary (found in the Messenger) or the book of Proverbs. We love to see you reading the Word of God!

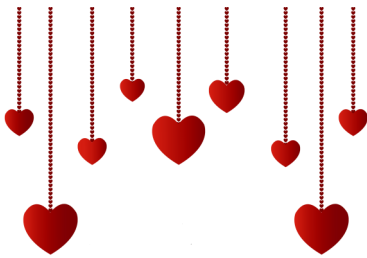
