A Message from Pastor

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,
Happy 2023!

A new year once again brings a new theme for us at St. Paul. Only this time, instead of lasting only a single year as the past two have, 202One in the Son and our 125th Anniversary, we will be spending the next few years with our theme.

Our theme is based on Ephesians 4:11-16, in which the Apostle Paul writes:

¹¹ It was he [Christ] who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, ¹² to **equip** the saints for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be **built up** ¹³ until we all reach **unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.** ¹⁴ Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of men in their deceitful scheming. ¹⁵ Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will in all things **grow** up into him who is the head, that is, Christ. ¹⁶ From him the whole body, joined and held **together** by every joint with which it is **equipped**, when each part is working properly, makes the body **grow** so that it **builds** itself up in love.

Equip. Build. Grow. Together. is our theme for 2023 and beyond. It will focus us in carrying out our mission statement, especially as we "share the Word of Christ to all".

Over the course of the next few years, we will unpack in greater detail what our theme means and how we will carry it out. But for now, here is a brief summary.

Christ has given to His Church on earth ministers of His Word. While much can be made about the offices and jobs Paul lists, two things are clear: they were part of the public ministry and they were given (instituted) by Christ. Public ministry is divinely given to the Church. But for what purpose?

God's purpose in establishing the public ministry is so "that the body of Christ may be built up". The "body of Christ" is the Church, the communion of saints. God wants that unity to be strengthened. This is the primary job of pastors, who feed and protect the flock, as well as search out the lost and straying. But as part of their work, God has directed them "to equip the saints for works of service/ministry". The goal of this is to "reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ". This building up of the saints is never complete in this life. But it is necessary to avoid being deceived by false teaching.

Paul makes it very clear that every Christian has a role in Christ's Church. No one is too small or too unimportant to make a difference. "Every joint" is important to the body. The whole body grows and builds itself up "when each part is working properly". **Every one of you is an important part of the Church.** Now, growth and improvement in the Church comes from Christ and not from us. But the Church suffers when any one wastes their God-given gifts. Think of the what misery and discomfort the whole body feels when one member is sick or fails to function properly. Therefore, we are to "speak the truth in love" not only to those outside of the Church, but also to those inside. The body of Christ only equips, builds, and grows if all of her members are united together in love. *(Continued on next page)*

(Pastor's Article Continued)

It's easy to fall into the trap that the Church is "all about me", when in reality, the Church is all about Jesus and us being built up and growing to maturity in Him. Our primary goal as His Church is to make disciples of all people by baptizing them in the name of God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything Christ commanded us. Christ has given His Church pastors and ministers who equip His saints through Word and Sacrament to carry out this Great Commission. This, in turn, leads to the saints being built up and growing to full maturity of faith in Christ. The saints, then, speak the truth in love to all they know and meet, which also "makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love".

How are we going to do this? Briefly, all of us have spheres of influence. These are areas in our daily and weekly lives and activities where we engage with others. Over the next few years, we're going to look at four spheres of influence we all share: Church, School, Home, and Community. All of us, in one way or another, come into contact with these four spheres. When we do, we have the ability to influence people in this sphere. This, then, becomes the primary way by which we will carry out our theme. For example, in the sphere of influence of our Homes, how do we, as St Paul Lutheran Church & School, *Equip, Build, and Grow Together?* Some ways are: At-home devotions; Daily reading of the Bible and/or Luther's Small Catechism; Daily Prayer; and/or Volunteering as a family at Church, School, and/or in our Community.

Hopefully you find this quick explanation to be helpful. As mentioned at the beginning, much, much more will be coming in the weeks, months, even years ahead.

As pastors of St. Paul, we invite and encourage you to join us in fulfilling our God-given mission under the theme *Equip. Build. Grow. Together.* for the next few years.

The Time of Christmas - Epiphany and Its Season

Epiphany is one of the oldest seasons in the Christian Church Year, second only to the Easter season. This season of lights emphasizes Jesus' manifestation (or epiphany, from the Greek *epiphaneia*) as God and man. The earliest Christians called the Feast of the Epiphany the Theophany ("revelation of God"). When the Gentile Magi come to worship Jesus, they show that everyone now has access to God. Now all people, Jew and Gentile, can come to God's temple to worship, because Jesus is the new temple: God in the flesh. The Epiphany of Our Lord (Jan. 6) marks the celebration of the visit of the Magi.

Epiphany Practices and Traditions

- ◆ Like Christmas, the Epiphany of Our Lord, the Baptism of Our Lord, and the Transfiguration of Our Lord are feast days of Jesus. The color for feast days is white, the color of divinity, purity, and joy. The Sundays after the Epiphany focus on the growth of Jesus' ministry, and the color green is used to symbolize that growth.
- ◆ On the First Sunday after the Epiphany, the Church celebrates the Baptism of Our Lord. The Father sent Jesus to bear the sins of the world. So Jesus steps down into baptismal waters so that He can soak up the sins of the world: He is baptized into our sins so that our Baptism might be into His death and resurrection for the forgiveness of sins. See Romans 6:1-11
