- If you have never experienced the danger of battle, the loneliness of imprisonment, the agony of torture, or the pangs of starvation... you are ahead of 500 million people in the world.
- If you can attend a church meeting without fear of harassment, arrest, torture, or death... you are more blessed than three billion people in the world.
- If you hold up your head with a smile on your face and are truly thankful... you are blessed because the majority can, but most do not.
- If you can read this message, you just received a double blessing in that someone was thinking of you, and furthermore, you are more blessed than over two billion people in the world who cannot read at all.

We are truly a blessed people. And yet, so often we complain about what we have <u>and</u> what we do not have. We forget sometimes that complaining about our lives is sinful. We are, in effect, telling God that we are not happy with what He has provided for us, and that we do not trust His promises to help us in times of trouble.
