Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

[Jesus said,] "4 Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. 5 I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing." (John 15:4-5 ESV)

Abide. This is the theme for the Professional Church Workers Conference many of the teachers and pastors are attending this November. It seems simple to *abide*: not working, not doing, not planning, not preparing, not teaching, not preaching, not organizing, not leading ... just *abiding*. Simple, yet hard. When was the last time you had the opportunity or took the time to *abide* with Jesus—to be nourished, encouraged, forgiven, strengthened, and filled ... by Him?

We have the opportunity to *abide* every weekend during our worship times and Bible studies. Through Word and Sacrament Jesus works faith and gives life. He nourishes and energizes us to live in faith. This time of worship and study brings us together with Jesus and keeps us together, like a vine and branches. And we bear fruit.

In order to bear fruit, however, we need to be connected to Jesus. Without Him, we are like a severed branch that dries up and is eventually thrown into the fire and burned. For apart from Jesus, we can do nothing.

Yet with Jesus, we can do anything. When we *abide* in Jesus and His words *abide* in us, we can ask Him for anything. Plus, everyone who is connected in faith will bear fruit and has the potential to bear still more and better fruit.

Beyond our worship and Bible study times, we are encouraged to stay connected with Jesus throughout the week. Take time each day to *abide* in prayer, in devotion, and in the reading of His Word. Stay connected to each other throughout the week as well, *abiding* together, bearing abundant fruit together. Our Christian life is not meant to be lived alone.

During our worship times, Bible studies, and all other ministries we will *abide* ... as we worship together, receive God's gifts together, laugh together, cry together, pray together, etc. We will celebrate and challenge one another, sharing a way of being and doing life and ministry together in Jesus. It's time to *abide in Jesus!*

Profits from the investments are disbursed annually per the Voters' Assembly approval. Any recognized board of St. Paul can submit requests. Requests are for projects and equipment not in the General Fund budget.

Total amount disbursed from funds earned in 2022 was \$47,113.00.

Facility & Property Improvement Fund

We have received \$471,168.95 of gifts and commitments to the **Facility and Property Improvement Fund**. This is a great start for the improvements that need to be accomplished. The Voters' Assembly approved a project that is expected to cost \$650,000. If you missed out on the opportunity to give or commit to this project there is still a need. Thank you!

Our landscaping and lawns have never looked better, we wish to thank each of these people for the dedication to this work.

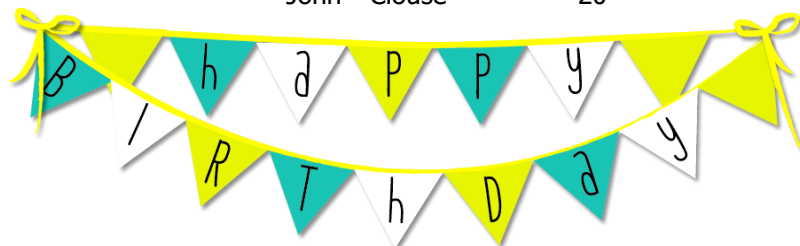

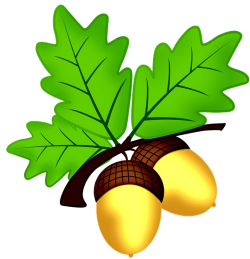
